Kristle Volin Memorial Scholarship



Kristle was born on September 18, 1987, in Ansbach, Germany to Andrew Warren and Kimberly (Canevari) Warren. Kristle moved to the Coos Bay area from Texas for her freshman year of high school. It was while attending high school at Marshfield that she began her love of biology and all things fish.

It was while taking science classes with Mr. Tinker that this passion started. Kristle was often found at one of the fish hatcheries or kid's fishing days doing what she loved best...working with fish!

Kristle went on to graduate from Marshfield High School, class of 2005. Financially it was going to be difficult for her to continue pursuing her passion for fish sciences in college, until she received a number of scholarships from the Marshfield Community and Memorial Scholarship Fund. These scholarships allowed Kristle to pursue her dream and attend Oregon State University, where she graduated in 2009 with a Bachelor's Degree in Fish and Wildlife. In the Summer of 2008, Kristle married her high school sweetheart,

Ty Volin. They moved back to Coos Bay in 2010 to start their new life together.

Kristle could be found counting fish for ODFW, working with Tom Rummerich at the Morgan Creek fish hatchery, and later working for the Coquille Watershed Association. She loved working outdoors and, in the water, restoring fish habitat. Kristle died in a tragic boating accident on the Coquille River in April of 2013 doing what she loved.

Kristle had a passion and desire for building and maintaining the natural resources of the bay area. It is our hope that this legacy will be carried on by future generations with the help of this scholarship in her name.
