

Luckman Legacy Scholarship



The Luckman legacy began in Coos county when Rupert and Violet Luckman moved to Coquille in the 1940's. They owned a farm and eventually a Flower shop. They passed their entrepreneurial spirit on to their 2nd son, Lucky and his wife Lorraine, when they joined together to open Flying L Rentals in Empire in the 1970s.

Lucky and Lorraine went on to purchase a rotational plastics manufacturing company that made Septic tanks in 1984, naming it Quadel Industries, Inc. They have added other products through the years such as water tanks up to 2500 gallons, custom tanks for outside customers, as well as handwash stations used at fairs and during Covid to help businesses across the country to be able to work safely again. A few years later they added plastic extrusions products such as seeding protectors for reforestation, mesh bags for flower bulbs, other plastic netting as well as erosion control netting used to clean up the 2010 oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

Their sons worked for them through their 20's when their oldest, Eric and wife Connie, a Marshfield 1989 graduate, took over the Luckman legacy in 1999. Since taking over we have added three more divisions. 2015 Q2i Archery which uses the plastic extrusion process to make fletching or vanes that are then sent all over the world to be adhered to arrow shafts. Some of these products then return to be sold here in the USA. 2016 Beaver State Plastics located in Drain Oregon uses an injection process and rubber molding. In 2010 we purchased a discount lumber yard, LNL Lumber Outlet.

All four of our children are Marshfield graduates; Andrew, 2010, Marissa 2012, Preston 2015, Eli 2025 and have been involved in our businesses from labors, janitorial, clerical, maintenance, accounting, management, graphic design, and sales.

Our kids were actively involved at Marshfield with journalism, dance, football, soccer, and they all enjoyed playing golf for Marshfield. We have been blessed and want to share that with a Marshfield graduate looking to further their education and dreams, be that college or a trade school.
